DELEGATION OF PARENTAL AUTHORITY — MINOR CHILD

2. Designation of Attorney-in-Fact

The Parent designates [AGENT NAME], of [AGENT ADDRESS], as attorney-in-fact (the "Agent") to exercise the parental authority described below during the delegation period.

3. Delegation Period

4. Delegated Authority

During the delegation period, the Agent may care for, supervise, and make day-to-day decisions for the Child, including:

1. Providing food, clothing, shelter, and transportation;
2. Supervising daily activities and routines;
3. Consenting to routine and emergency medical, surgical, dental, and mental health care, including hospitalization, anesthesia, surgery, prescription medication, and immunizations — and receiving the Child's PHI under 45 C.F.R. §164.502(g);
4. Enrolling the Child in school or childcare, attending parent-teacher conferences, accessing the Child's educational records under FERPA (20 U.S.C. §1232g), and making day-to-day educational decisions;

5. Taking any other action a reasonable parent would take to protect the Child's welfare.

5. Limitations

The Agent is **not** authorized to: (a) consent to the Child's marriage; (b) consent to the Child's adoption; (c) consent to any abortion or sterilization; or (d) terminate, modify, or limit the Parent's parental rights. This delegation does **not** transfer legal custody or guardianship; the Parent retains full parental rights and may revoke this delegation at any time.

6. Revocation

May be revoked at any time by written notice from the Parent to the Agent. Upon revocation, the Agent shall immediately return the Child to the Parent.

7. Governing Law

Governed by [STATE] law.
